

Will Hiring a Social Security Attorney Guarantee Approval of Your Application?

Q: Will hiring a social security attorney help me get approval for social security disability benefits?

A: You do not necessarily need to hire a social security attorney. Many who apply for benefits with the Social Security Administration are denied approval. Those wishing to appeal their case would be wise to seek counsel from a social security attorney. Hiring a social security attorney does not mean your case will be approved. It simply helps to assure that your case is properly handled. A social security attorney will assure that all the details for your hearing are prepared and will know how to navigate the process.

Q: When should I apply for social security disability benefits?

A: You should apply for benefits as soon as you become unable to work due to your injury. Although the current estimated time of application processing is 90 to 120 days, it is not uncommon for the process to take over 6 months. That is why you should apply for benefits as soon as possible. If your application is denied, you will probably want to appeal, which adds more time to the process. If you have any questions or concerns about the application process, you may want to contact a social security attorney.

Q: What is the difference between SSDI and SSI? Q: Are disability benefits and SSI the same thing?

A: Both SSDI (Social Security Disability Insurance) and SSI (Supplemental Security Income) are programs for people who have been injured and are not able to work. Only people who have been working for a certain amount of time and have contributed to Social Security qualify for SSDI. SSI, on the other hand, is based on financial need.
